Covid regulations permitting, we will be holding the 133rd Annual Show on 2nd October this year. It will be slightly different from previous Shows as we will be taking all the necessary safety precautions to minimise any Covid risks, but we will be aiming for a good afternoon out for all visitors as well as competitors.

All the usual popular classes will be available to enter, so if you got the gardening bug last year why don't you think about entering some of your fruit or veg? Or what about your cake baking (see below for more details on some changes), photography, jams and pickles, painting, Floral Art, wine making, handicrafts, needlework, flowers and more? There are plenty of classes to choose from including classes specifically for children.

Following the popularity of the Scarecrow competition last year we are holding it again. There will be a class for a traditional (standing) scarecrow and a class for a scarecrow with a Hollywood theme. We will be asking for scarecrows to be displayed on Saturday 25th September for judging that day with the prizes being announced on 26th. We want the scarecrows to be kept in place until 3rd so people can see them on Show Day. At the Show, a cup will be awarded for the best overall scarecrow.

In the baking classes, there is a new class for a decorative cake, one tier and maximum 8", which will be judged on its decoration only and the gluten free cake is replaced with a vegan cake (recipe of your choice, but the recipe must be displayed on the day).

The Show recipe for this year for children is for honey and raisin oat cookies:

Honey & Raisin Oat Cookies

Ingredients:	
150g	Plain Flour
90g	Porridge Oats
200g	Caster Sugar
90g	Raisins
70g	Ground Almonds
125g	Butter
2 teaspoons	Cinnamon
1/2 teaspoon	Bicarbonate of soda
2 teaspoons	Boiling water
2 tablespoons	Honey

Method

- 1. Pre-heat oven 150°C/130°C fan/gas 2. Line 2
- baking trays.
 Combine flour, oats, cinnamon, sugar, raisins & ground almonds.
- Melt butter. Combine boiling water, honey & biker. Add to butter.
- Stir butter mixture into dry ingredients. Roll a level teaspoon into ball and press down lightly with spoon on baking trays. Leave room to spread when baking.
- 5. Bake for 20mins then cool.

Neighbourhood Plan Update



The final revisions are being made to the Regulation 16 draft Plan. The draft Plan, with other supporting documents, will be submitted to West Lindsey District Council. In due course there will be a referendum when you will be invited to vote on adoption of the Plan.

MESSAGE TO DOG WALKERS

There are some lovely walks around the area and they are particularly important to people's health and wellbeing. They are enjoyed by lots of people.

Crossing point

During the walkabouts in 2019 as part of the Neighbourhood Planning process, people pointed out that the lowered pavement for a wheelchair crossing on the main road through the village is in an unsafe place, given the traffic. The Parish Council has lobbied for sometime for it to be moved and has had meetings with Highways. We understand that the work is now scheduled for the week beginning 2nd August. It will involve temporary lights while the work is being done and is scheduled to take four days.

Our thanks to David Justham, who, on behalf he Parish Council, has been looking into the history of ownership of Parish land. This is what he has discovered about the Parish Field:

Parish Field

In addition to the Play Park and the Cemetery, both on Stow Park Road, the Parish Council also owns a field on Fleets Lane. The history of how it came to be in the Parish Council's ownership begins with the 1803 Enclosure Act related specifically to Stow, Sturton and Bransby. The purpose of the Act was to enable the enclosure of common land surrounding the villages and to allocate to whom it should belong. The subsequent 1808 Enclosure Award map and details confirm that the land, now known as the Parish Field, was awarded to the Surveyor of Highways for Stow. The Surveyor of Highways was awarded the land "for the purpose of getting stone sand gravel and any other materials for repairing the public and private roads and highways within the said township of Stowe" and further grants to the surveyor the right to rent the field via a process of public auction to raise income. The Highways Act of 1835 required the surveyor to be elected annually at the Parish Meeting. At this time the Parish Meeting was held each year, and its principal purpose was to elect not only the Surveyor of Highways for the village, but also the Overseer for the Poor and the Churchwardens for the Parish.

In 1839 the field was recorded as still belonging to the Surveyor of Highways. It was then called "Stone Pit Close", and it's state of cultivation as "grass". The Annual Parish Meeting was a long established process for community decision making and, prior to the Local Government Act 1894, was managed by the established church.

Lincolnshire Archives holds the minute book for 1894 to 1921 for the Stow Parish Meeting. One of the earliest entries records the meeting held on 15th April 1895 when a public auction was held at which Mr. Milns made a successful bid of £2 2s 6d to rent "Stone Pit Field" - and follows the Enclosure Award's prescribed process. The minute book shows that the field continued to be rented on an annual basis by the Parish Meeting.

The 1894 Local Government Act created Gainsborough Rural District Council, and allowed for Town and Parish Councils to be created, though Stow, being a small village, appears to have retained the option to manage its public affairs through the Parish Meeting until sometime after 1921 when the creation of Stow Parish Council eventually occurred. The Enclosure Award gave the field to the surveyor and to "successors for ever". For this reason the Parish Council inherited the field from the Parish Meeting, who had control of the field once there was no longer a parish appointed surveyor

SPEED LIMITS

After lobbying by the Parish Council for sometime, the County Council has changed the speed limit between Stow and Sturton to 40mph instead of 50mph.
