UPDATE FROM THE NEIGHBOURHOOD PLANNING GROUP

The creation of the first Sturton By Stow and Stow Neighbourhood Plan has reached a momentous stage. After collating all the comments that came in during the Regulation 14

consultation and making the necessary amendments, the planning group, on behalf of the two Parish Councils, under Regulation 16 has submitted our draft Plan and supporting documents to West Lindsey District Council (WLDC). There is now a further period of consultation – see the official notice from WLDC – which will finish on October 22<sup>nd</sup> and comments should be made direct to WLDC. After that an independent examiner will be appointed to scrutinise the draft Plan and make any final recommendations for changes, prior to a public referendum.

WLDC is consulting on the submission version of the Neighbourhood Plan, which meets statutory requirements.

### Normanby Road (B1241) crossing

You may have wondered why the traffic lights were there at the beginning of August and what was being done. Highways commissioned moving the accessible crossing to a position safer for those needing to cross the busy road with a mobility scooter, wheelchair, pram or buggy.

Covid regulations permitting, the 133<sup>rd</sup> Annual Show will be held on 2<sup>nd</sup> October this year. The Show Committee will be taking all the necessary safety precautions to minimise any Covid risks, but will be aiming for a good afternoon out for all visitors as well as competitors.

All the usual popular classes will be available to enter, so if you got the gardening bug last year why don't you think about entering some of your fruit or veg? Or what about your cake baking, photography, jams and pickles, painting, Floral Art, wine making, handicrafts, needlework, flowers and more? There are plenty of classes to choose from including classes specifically for children.

Following the popularity of the Scarecrow competition last year it is being held again. There will be a class for a traditional (standing) scarecrow and a class for a scarecrow with a Hollywood theme. The entry form will need to be completed and submitted a week in advance (details will be on the website).
