Planting a tree

Some of you will be aware that a tree was taken down on the Village Green opposite St Mary's.

The Parish Council was to replace the tree in that position, but at the Parish Council Meeting on 6th September, there was a debate about this as some councillors expressed the view that they rather liked the open aspect this now gives. There were, however, strong views we should, in some way, replace the tree even if it was not in that exact position.

Before we decide on what best to do, we would like your views and there are three options:

- Do nothing
- 2. Replace the tree on the Village Green
- 3. Plant a tree in replacement, but at another location. This could be:
 - a) In the meadow adjacent to the cemetery or
 - b) on the Parish Field.

(We already have several trees in the Play Park and would want to maintain the space for play).

UPDATE FROM THE NEIGHBOURHOOD PLANNING GROUP

The creation of the first Sturton By Stow and Stow Neighbourhood Plan has reached a momentous stage.

After collating all the comments that came in during the Regulation 14 consultation and making the necessary amendments, the planning group, on behalf of the two Parish Councils, has, under Regulation 16, submitted our draft Plan and supporting documents to West Lindsey District Council (WLDC). There has been a further period of consultation – see the official notice from WLDC – which finished on October 22nd with comments direct to WLDC. After that, an independent examiner will be appointed to scrutinise the draft Plan and make any final recommendations for changes, prior to a public referendum.

MAINTENANCE OF FOOTPATHS

The responsibility for the maintenance of public footpaths lies with the County Council. If you find a fault with a footpath you can report it to the County Council via their website www.lincolnshire.gov.uk.

However, the owner of any property (residential or commercial) adjoining a public footpath is responsible for their side of it and must ensure any hedge or fence does not obstruct the lawful passage of pedestrians. This means if a tree or hedge on your property's boundary is overhanging a footpath and blocking it, it is your responsibility to remove it.

The County Council has the power to remove any obstruction and to bill the householder for any costs.

Maintenance of Public Rights of Way (PROW) eg across fields, is the responsibility of the landowner. If you become aware of a problem with access to a PROW you can contact the Countryside Service at the County Council: countrysideaccess@lincolnshire.gov.uk or phone 01522 782070.

New bench for Stow Park Road - exercise your vote

The Stow Recreation Fund committee will make a decision on November 8th as to whether the new bench on Stow Park Road, (to be positioned on the verge to the north of the road, east of the entrance to the public bridleway towards Willingham) will be facing north (Willingham) or the south (Sturton).

No kite flying in the play park

We need to remind parents that kite flying **is not allowed** in the play park because of overhead cables.

We have given notice (the required one year) to Northern Power to remove the telegraph pole from the play park.

Defibrillator training

Further to previous notices, and the post on the village Facebook page, the training is now likely to happen on a Thursday in late November or early December, during the day.

Clare is still chasing LIVES for confirmation of the date/ time, but due to the amount of interest, thinks they will be at the Cross Keys for 2 hours and we will split the time into 3 x 40 minute sessions, with different people in each session. Further details will be circulated to everyone who expresses an interest in attending to learn, or have a refresher on, how to use the defibrillator. Once you've attended a session you should feel confident in using any defibrillator, and realise how simple it can be to potentially save lives.

Message from the Lincolnshire Road Safety Partnership -New air freshener campaign to remind road users to stay safe

Our new road safety campaign will urge drivers to "Belt up. Hang up. Ease up." every time they step inside their vehicle.

We're offering free air fresheners for members of the public, with each featuring a simple message to give people pause for thought before they set off on their journey. The air fresheners are jasmine-scented, feature a red outline to represent a "stop" sign, and three icons representing each theme, along with the slogan.

On far too many occasions, we witness first-hand the devastating consequences that speeding, using a mobile phone at the wheel, or failing to wear a seatbelt can have. Research shows:

- You are four times more likely to be in a crash if you use your phone, and reactions two times slower if you text and drive than if you drink drive;
- This increases to 3 times if you use a handheld phone;
- You are twice as likely to die if you don't wear a seat belt, and people are less likely to use seat belts on short or familiar journeys;
- If someone drives more than 10 to 15% above the average speed of the traffic around them, they are much more likely to be involved in an accident.

It was launched on Wednesday 29th September by Lincolnshire Police and the Lincolnshire Road Safety Partnership to encourage people to take responsibility for safer driving as the nights get darker.

The air fresheners can be collected from the front desk at the police station in Gainsborough and local PCSO and officers in the Neighbourhood Policing Teams will hand them out where possible.

SOLAR FARM PLANS

You may have seen the feature on Look North or read about it in the Lincolnshire Echo - plans are afoot for a major solar energy development this side of the Trent. The development includes the Cottam and West Burton former power stations with the land for siting the solar panels being in West Lindsey.

The proposed Cottam I would cover land in the Stow and Sturton parishes. There will be a period of public consultation expected to start this autumn.

STOW LIVING ADVENT CALENDAR

After the great success and popularity of last year's Living Advent calendar, and lots of enthusiasm on the village Facebook page for it to be repeated, there will be another one in Stow this year.

For those of you new to the village - the idea is that volunteers from 24 houses in Stow will decorate and light up a window in their house with festive decorations in December. One window is 'opened' each day from 1st to the 24th December and remains illuminated until 12th night (6th January). The aim is simply to have fun and create a nice way of bringing the community together. It isn't a competition and we hope that people of all generations will want to get involved.

What do we do to take part?

You decorate a window in your house that can be seen from the road/ public footpath, and 'reveal' it on your allocated day in Advent – if possible have it lit up either with decorative lights or have the room light on. No-one will be coming on to your property to view the window, so there won't be any security or social distancing issues.

What kind of decorations should we use?

Anything you like! The only guidelines are that it needs to be centred around a window that can be viewed by the public, and it needs to have your allocated number (date) as part of the display so that people know you are part of the Advent calendar. Maybe cut out some folded snowflakes and stick them to the inside of your window, knit or crochet a snowman and hang it in the window, draw a picture, hang some baubles on a piece of Christmas tree, make a little wreath, do something on the theme of the number you are given eg. '5 gold rings' if you get 5th December, depict your favourite Christmas Carol or Christmas story.... Use your imagination — but it doesn't have to be complicated or elaborate - there is no need to go and buy anything expensive!

How will we know where the windows are each day?

We will put a map of the Living Advent Calendar on the Stow Community Facebook page, on the notice board in the bus shelter, in a window at the Cross Keys, will email it out to anyone who asks for a copy or pop a copy through the letterbox of anyone who is not 'on the internet' and would still like to follow the trail.

How do we take part?

Stow Recreation Fund – public meeting

As most of the projects funded by the SRF have now been completed, the trustees are starting to plan for the winding up of the fund. We hope that the village signs, and the last bench, will all be in place by the end of the year and that the defibrillator training will have taken place.

The SRF constitution provides that in order for it to be wound up, there has to be approval from a 2/3 majority of those present and entitled to vote at a Special General Meeting. A report will be prepared prior to such a meeting, with a map showing the locations of the various projects and a breakdown of the monies spent on each project. This will be displayed on a noticeboard in the church and on the village noticeboard, and emailed out to all residents who are on the village email list.

The public meeting will take place as soon as possible after the projects are completed, so hopefully in January 2022. Can anyone who would be interested in attending such a meeting please give an indication of whether they would prefer it to be face to face eg in the church, or virtual by means of a zoom link.
