NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN On 26th May - Make Your Vote Count!



May 26th is a momentous day for both Sturton and Stow parishes. This is your opportunity to vote on whether the Plan should be adopted.

You will be asked to vote on: "Do you want West Lindsey District Council to use the Neighbourhood Plan for Sturton by Stow and Stow to help it decide planning applications in the neighbourhood area?"

10.30 – 2pm **Saturday 21st May** in the Old Schoolroom, Sturton there will be an opportunity to ask questions about the Plan and talk to some of those who have worked on it. On 26th May voting will be in St Mary's (or by postal vote if you have arranged that). Using the evidence gained through the consultation events, surveys, attendance at public events and walkabouts it has been possible to draw insights into what are the important issues that our residents wish to see in the local Neighbourhood Plan, remembering that the plan is essentially a land use plan and subordinate to higher level plans from District, County and UK Government levels. The issues have been translated into a range of policies listed below that will be adopted by both Parish and District Councils and guide their decision-making. Wider residents' aspirations have not been ignored and are listed in an appendix at the end of the plan.

Without a neighbourhood plan residents will have little or no influence on planning decisions.
