ELECTIONS

Message from West Lindsey: "Residents will need to ensure that they are registered to vote in the elections, which only takes five minutes to register online at GOV.UK and that they have the right form of ID if voting in person.

For the first time in the district, people are being asked to provide an accepted form of ID to be able to vote in the West Lindsey local elections on 4 May and the town and parish council elections. It may seem early but checking now means you will be ready to vote in May.

Residents who do not have one of the accepted forms of ID can apply for free ID either online or by completing a paper application form and sending this to West Lindsey District Council's electoral services team.

If you would like to be kept updated about how the application is progressing and/ or make any representations for or against the plans, you now need to register as an 'interested party' on the National Infrastructure Planning site. Click on this link to get to the form

You do not have to give your full detailed views/ objections/ support yet- you are just asked to provide your contact details and a 'summary of points which you agree and/or disagree with about the application, highlighting what you consider to be the main issues and impacts'. You can then make further representations as the consultation period progresses. Community Aspirations

I the last edition we published the Council's position statement on meeting the Community Aspirations appended to the Neighbourhood Plan. These were non planning aspirations raised by members of the community during the neighbourhood planning process.

We have received the following suggested additions to the list:

1. Dog waste bins on Normanby Road perhaps one close to the Stow sign and the other at the junction with Coates Lane near the Normanby sign

Reduce speed on School Lane by either:
 a) School Lane being designated as resident access only to reduce the use as a Rat Run (some at quite some speed) and maybe stop the numbers who go the wrong way; or
 b) place a camera at the end of the road to catch those travelling the wrong way; or
 c) install speed bumps.
