Public Footpaths

The responsibility for the maintenance of public footpaths lies with the County Council. If you find a fault with a footpath you can report it to the County Council via their website www.lincolnshire.gov.uk or ring 01522 782070 between 8am and 6pm.

However, the owner of any property (residential or commercial) adjoining a public footpath is responsible for their side of it and must ensure any hedge or fence does not obstruct the lawful passage of pedestrians. This means if a tree or hedge on your property's boundary is overhanging a footpath and blocking it, it is your responsibility to remove it.

The same applies if a tree or shrub on your property is obscuring the view of a driver – it is important that visibility at junctions is maintained.

The County Council has the power to remove any obstruction and to bill the householder for any costs.

Maintenance of Public Rights of Way (PROW) eg across fields, is the responsibility of the landowner. If you become aware of a problem with access to a PROW you can contact the Countryside Service at the County Council: countryside_access@lincolnshire.gov.uk or phone 01522 782070 (8-6).

Cottam

We have now had notification that the Preliminary Meeting and Examination (of process) will be at Lincolnshire Showground on $5^{\rm th}$ September.

In reviewing some of the documents we have learned that some of the fields originally proposed for solar panels or as a lorry park are no longer included and we came across the following statement:

"Design and access statement

5.4.5 Specific design changes were made to each of the Sites ahead of publication for PEIR and statutory consultation.

5.4.6 On Cottam 1, field numbers A3, B1, and D19 (refer to field numbering plans at **Appendix 1: Figures 6.1-6.3**) were removed to address residential amenity concerns. Fields D1, D7 (west end), D8, and E3 were removed at the request of Stow Parish Council and F1, F2, and F7 were removed upon request by Stow Parish Council on behalf of the residents of the hamlet of Normanby by Stow. The removed fields in Site F were also due to be removed as a result of archaeological interest in the Normanby by Stow mediaeval village. The proposed solar arrays were removed from C28, F1, F2 and

F7 due to results of geophysical surveys which indicated areas of unmitigable archaeological interest."

Clearly a lot of people made comments, but it looks as if Stow Parish Council is being credited with some representation made by other councils as A3 and B1 are in Willingham and D19 in Thorpe; however, D1, D7, D8, E3 are around Ingham Road/Fleets Lane; and F1, F2 and F7 are adjacent to East Farm and the flat tops at Normanby; C28 is Fillingham. We had already obtained a commitment the Green Lane would not be used as a construction route and are pressing that it should not be used for access in the operational phase of the project either.

In other words, it is worth making representations. That said, there is still some development intended in our parish including two fields proposed for panels at the northwest corner of Green Lane on the south side of Coates Lane either side of the Till. There is also a field nearer the Till between Ingham Road and Coates Lane. There is a new track proposed for construction traffic 100 metres east of 31, Ingham Road going from Ingham Road north. This is still near to local residents' homes and raises the question as to why one of the pre-existing tracks could not be used further east on Stow Lane.

There are further issues about the construction phase, not least the proposal to bring large vehicles and huge, long and very heavy, "Abnormal Loads" from Tillbridge Lane, through Sturton and through Stow. These include five very big transformers bound for Cotgarth Lane in Willingham, and 75 cable drums for three cable route accesses on the B1241 (Normanby Road) and potentially further cable drums for three more accesses further to the North. The potential risk from these long vehicles in terms of the Scheduled Monument of the remains of the Benedictine Abbey and College at Stow Minster is acknowledged and it is proposed that banksmen will be employed to ensure there is no mishap. We query if this is adequate for such a valuable monument. The movement of these large vehicles will necessitate temporary road closures or use of traffic lights. Not only will there be the large vehicles, but also the vehicles for those working on the project. The additional traffic during construction will add to vibration, noise and air pollution and will be of particular concern to residents along the route including potentially the school. There will also an impact on residents of road closures or traffic lights on Ingham Road, the narrows (Stow Lane), Fleets Lane and Thorpe Lane during the construction phase.

A continuing issue is the sheer number of applications that affect our Parish and their potential cumulative impact. It is very difficult to see an application in isolation.

In terms of the next stages: if you registered an interest you will have been notified that the Examination will open on 5th September at the Showground.

Whether or not you registered it is possible to attend in person, to hear the discussion in a live stream on the website or watch a recording. For details you will need to go to the National Infrastructure Planning website and look at the Cottam project papers and the letter from the Examiner which sets it all out.

There is an argument for attending in person to show strength of feeling. There will be an Open Floor Hearing in the afternoon and a Specific Issues hearing on 6th. The hearing on the 5th is purely about the process. The letter says: "The main purpose of the Preliminary Meeting is to discuss the arrangements for the Examination of the application. It will focus on the process only and will not be looking at the substance of the application. Questions, discussions and representations about the merits or disadvantages of the Proposed Development are for the Examination itself, which will begin the day after the close of the Preliminary Meeting. "

7000 Acres, the campaigning group, has written:The Preliminary Meeting and Open Floor Hearing will take place on the 5th September and an Issue Specific Hearing will be held on the 6th of September.

The Planning Inspectorate for the Cottam Solar Project have listened to our request regarding the venue and you will note that, the meetings and hearings mentioned above are being held at the Lincolnshire Showground, Grange-de-Lings, Lincoln LN2 2NA.

We believe that the process and the applications are fundamentally flawed as:

- The scale and number of these schemes in a short space of time does not enable people to engage with the process;
- The applications need to be considered together as they are all in West Lindsey District and jointly effect us and the area;
- Two of the schemes are being proposed by the same developer, Island Green Power, which shows they are joined schemes;
- A greater period of time needs to be provided between each examination to help residents prepare and become involved.

The above aspects are confusing in their own right, but it is made worse by one of the projects being named West Burton Solar Project and another developer branding their proposal as Gate Burton Energy Park. This use of similar names only adds to the confusion. It is easy to see that with these proposals running at roughly the same time, confusion could prevent opposition and cause the general public to lose track of where each one is in the process.

Also, these 4 huge proposals are not the only ones in Lincolnshire (there are at least 9 proposed for this county alone). The difference is that these 4 schemes, are all within a few miles of each other!

PLEASE SEE BELOW, FOR WHAT YOU NEED TO BE

Procedural Deadline A. Tuesday 22nd August.

Deadline for receipt by the Examining Authority of:

- · written submissions about how the application should be examined. See bullet points above for guidance.
- · requests to speak at the Preliminary Meeting. Important to show public feeling.
- requests to speak at the Open Floor Hearing 1. Have your say.
- · requests to speak at the Issue Specific Hearing 1 regarding the draft Development Consent Order (DCO). Do you agree with the detail in the DCO.
- suggested locations for site inspections, including reasons for nomination, issues to be observed there and whether the location(s) require access to private land. Important that the Inspectorate sees the true horrors of these proposals.

We urge you all to feedback to the Planning inspectorate, under 'Make a submission'.
