THE POST OFFICE IS IN ST MARY'S, BEHIND THE ORGAN. IT IS USUALLY OPEN:



Most volunteers work in teams of 2 - one to hold the bag and one to use the picking stick. A van is always available to collect any bags you leave on the verges and to pick up any larger items you find. The more volunteers that help out, the more areas we can cover in a shorter time - the four main routes into the village are usually the priority, but if enough people come along we can also do the public footpaths in and out of the village

If you haven't been before - or if you are a 'regular' - please do come along to help clean up OUR community paths and verges.

A BONUS - is that to thank you for your time and effort, on your return to the farm you are invited to stay for refreshments. If you are not able to come along and pick - maybe you would like to donate some biscuits/a cake/flapjack etc. for the volunteers' refreshments?
