2025 is the 200th anniversary year of Stow's <u>Wesleyan Chapel.</u>

This image captures Stow St. Mary's Church towering in the background and presents a poignant reminder of social change. Today a private residence, the chapel was built in 1824 and began service in 1825. Our rural communities were a microcosm of social upheaval throughout the county and country. In adjacent villages, Sturton and Willingham chapels had arrived 20 years earlier. The 19th-century development of our chapels and schools, with bizarre stories of local conflict, is retold in 'STOW WARS'. Copies of this book can be obtained from Sturton & Stow History Society; the author is Historian Linda Crust, the Society President until she passed away in 2016.

Easter at Stow

"Our service this year begins at **7.00pm on Maundy Thursday, 17th April**. Maundy Thursday traditionally recognises the institution of the Lord's Supper. And in many places, as at Stow, the washing of feet is included to reflect that at the last supper Jesus washed his disciples' feet, the leader is also the servant. The service often ends with the Stripping of the Altar - a tradition that developed simply because the altar guilds needed to strip the altar after Maundy Thursday in preparation for the bare, stark altar on Good Friday. Following the service there is the opportunity to join a time of silent watch and prayer, as we remember Jesus and the disciples in the Garden of Gethsemane.

Easter Sunday Services are:

Easter Dawn Service at 5.45am at St Edith's, Coates, normally a lovely Service outside watching the Sun Rise around a warming fire.

10.30 at St Helen's, Willingham

Churches Festival, May 10th & 11th and May 17th & 18th

This year's Churches Festival in West Lindsey will run over two weekends in May. In our area of West Lindsey participating churches will open for the festival over the first weekend, being 10th and 11th May.

At St Mary's Church, Stow our theme this year explores the role of Vikings within our area of West Lindsey, their local encampments, trading and farming activities, and their relationship with the church. Important features within the church include Viking graffiti from 10th/11th century and parts of a Viking grave marker."

A van is always available to collect any bags you leave on the verges and to pick up any larger items you find. The more volunteers that help out, the more areas we can cover in a shorter time - the four main routes into the village are usually the priority, but if enough people come along we can also do the public footpaths in and out of the village

If you haven't been before - or if you are a 'regular' please do come along to help clean up OUR community paths and verges. Stow Fun Raisers accept no liability for any injury or loss suffered taking part in the community litter pick.
